The following rules for this competition apply from 1st January, 1977. Each year between 1st January and 31st December points will 'be recorded for each Patrol in the Letchworth & Baldock Scout District, with the object of discovering the most active and successful Patrol of the year. The Patrol gaining most points by 31st December each year will hold the JIM NORTHOVER MEMORIAL SHIELD for the following year and also receive a special prize, the nature of which may vary.

 $\,\,$ Points in sections A and B will be awarded automatically and no claims are necessary.
