#### THIS IS YOUR ZONE!

The GSLs' meeting on the 23rd November authorized the ADC (Scout Fellowship) to adjust the zones in Letchworth for which various troops have responsibility for delivery of things, such as the Newsletter for the Blind. These zones were originally drawn up by DC Leslie Brown for the old "Bob-a-job Week" and have been modified several times, but this latest amendment allows the-two newest groups to play their part, while reducing the large areas of responsibility for some of the older groups.

- 12L zone is Penn Way and its branches; and William village which was formerly 5L country.
- <u>11L</u> zone is Rushby Mead (except the southern part where llL HQ is situated!) extending eastwards between the railway line and Baldock Road.
- zone includes the whole of Baldock Road, and Pixmore Way, Howard Drive, the Manor Park estate, and also parts of the former 1-3L and 5L zones namely; everything east of Broadway and as far north as Gernon Road.
- 5L zone is reduced, the eastern limit now being Broadway and Pasture Road.
- 10L zone is unchanged, being the Jackmans Estate.
- zone is reduced, including Bedford Road only west of Corner Close, and Wilbury Road west of Standalone.
- 1-3Lzona has slid northwards, losing everything south of the railway except the shopping area, and now including Haselfoot, Saffron Hill, Haymoor, Longmead and most of Wilbury Road (formerly 7L zone), and Norton Road with everything west of Green Lane (formerly 8L).
- 8L zone still includes Green Lane, Norton village and the Grange Estate.
- BALDOCK continues as before, with the old Great North Road as the division.  $\underline{\text{East}}$  of this is 1B zone:  $\underline{\text{west}}$  is 2B in thé hopeful anticipation of the rebirth of the Scout troop.
