CONGRATULATIONS to the OWLS, who celebrated the Silver Jubilee of Fifth Letchworth Scout Group (the exact anniversary of the first pack meeting at Westbury School!) by winning a rather difficult competition in great style. (For the record, it is the second time this patrol has won the B-P Guild Cup, the previous occasion being in 1970 under PL Kevin Smith). This year's contest was programmed for the eight patrols who got their entries in on time; it's a pity that more did not enter, and also that one of the eight had to withdraw and another just didn't turn up. It was planned as a fairly tough, but not impossible, physical and intellectual test, and all patrols who completed the course are to be commended for their cheerfulness and sense of adventure.

Some would have done a lot better if they had read the rules more carefully - especially the recommendation that knowledge of eight-figure map references was essential. At the start the organizer explained to each patrol how to make a simple roamer, but it doesn't appear likely that any patrol made use of the suggestion, and in consequence there was a great deal of wild guessing ("It's probably somewhere about there .....") when reading the reference correctly would have found the precise solution quite easily.
