My five-year term of office as ADC (Fellowship) having ended on 31st March, I must say "thank you" to everyone who has helped to build up the District Scout Fellowship into the positive and powerful presence which it now is. I hope to remain a reasonably active member, and will do all I can to support the new ADC and our champion chairman Alan who has really made the Fellowship into a respectable organization.

For my last official duty I attended the County Fellowship Day on 28th March at Tenth Harpenden HQ. Though unfortunately I was the only representative of Letchworth & Baldock, this does enable me to give you the following brief report without fear of contradiction.

ACC Keith Brooker had specially asked for our District display stand to be on show as an example to the rest of the County, and it was nice to hear it highly praised by the very best authorities! More impressive, though, was the presence of about a dozen members of the newest District Fellowship, Rickmdhsworth & Choxleywood, all in their twenties and uniformly dressed in their otn logo-teeshirts. Younger faces of ex-Venture Scouts from various other districts were well scattered among the older familiar monuments, and this was most encouraging.

Ted Hayden, Executive Commissioner and Secretary of The Scout Association, was the star guest. He told me afterwards how he once had actually passed through Baldock! His main theme to the conference, however, was that Fellowship should be totally flexible, with separate activities for different age groups, not trying to bring those of 18 and 81 together except on rare special occasions.

On the sore question of the membership fee, Ted said that Fellows are people committed to Scouting and therefore are paid for at the same rate as every Cub, Scout, and Leader. Exempting them would mean tenpence extra on every one else's fee! Some District Fellowships, he said, accept married couples on a single subscription, covering the difference from their own "internal arrangements". Good idea.

There was a tremendous lot more in the six hours at Harpenden: Conrad Ascher on how we could run Explorer Belt courses - Colin Limming asking for Fellowship hobbies to go on his lists of Other Activities - James Kingham shaming the rest of us with his anecdotes of the close co-operation of Fellowship and Venture Scouting in Harpenden - Keith Brooker summing up with: "I think the future of Scouting may depend on that link".

Well, I may be only an ex-ADC, but if anyone in the Dïstrict wants to. chat over the other notes I made at this excellent meeting, I'll be happy to oblige, any time.
