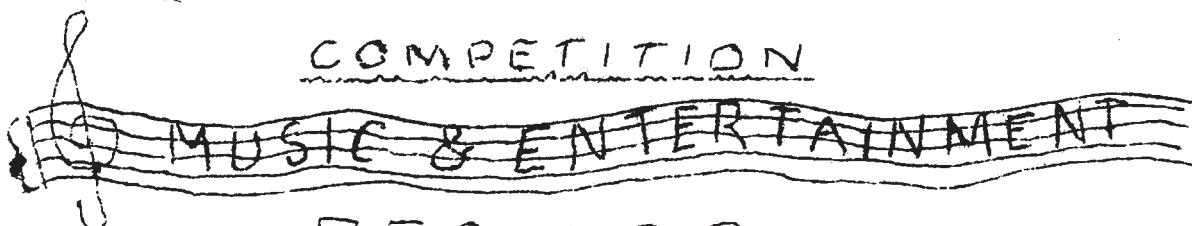

75 - 84 " : 2nd. class
70 - 74 " : 3rd. class
60 - 69 " : H. C.
