First, a restatement of the various Trophies which are presented to winning participants of the Arts and Crafts Competition. This is being done because we have a number of new-comers, both on the Uniformed and Lay sides, who are not as familiar with them as some of the old 'ins.

THE BLAXLAND TROPHY: Is presented to the Cub Pack gaining most points.
THE WATSON TROPHY: Is presented to the Scout Troop gaining most points.
THE EAVES TROPHY: Goes to the Adult gaining the most points.
THE PLINSTON TROPHY: Is awarded to the Group earning most points from its combined Pack and Troop results.
