# CUBS' FIRST AIB COMPETITION ...

<u>Back in 1961</u> this District saw the first of the Cubs' First Aid Competitions, and this gave everyone a realisation of the benefits of starting First Aid Training to boys at an early age.

<u>With the exception of 1975</u>, there has been a competition every year since, some of them out of doors . . . . in a 'camping' environment. . . . and others inside if the weather was not good.

### What St John's said ...

<u>We are greatly impressed</u> and very pleased with the much improved standards of First Aid at the above competition. The teams were a credit to their instructors.

The following are a few comments which we hope will be helpful:-

<u>BURN of HAND</u>: To combat shock always loosen tight clothes at neck, chest and waist.

BRUISED ARM & LOOSE KNEE BANDAGE AT SPORTS DAY: Do sit patient down and then enquire what happened. Stay with patient and send a message

#### Cont'd from page 2. 'What St. John's said':

by an adult, if possible, for Parent or Guardian, or 'phone.

ARTIFICIAL RESPIRATION: When finding a person on the ground, speak to him; if he does not answer check if he is breathing (hand on chest, cheek against his nose and mouth). If not breathing <u>clear mouth</u> then give artificial respiration <u>until he breathes himself</u>.

When placing in the 'recovery position' after rolling him on to his side, draw leg up FIRST then do the rest.

Always loosen tight clothing and keep warm with coats or blankets.

<u>CUT HAND</u>: Do sit or lay patient down to combat shock. Look for foreign bodies in the wound. Do not use antiseptic neat - always dilute it, and remove adhesive plaster gently.
