News Letters for the Blind ___

<u>For some time our Scouts</u> have been delivering and, where required, reading to the blind their quarterly news-letter. We have received a letter from Mrs Jean Fenton, Secretary of the Hertfordshire Society for the Blind regarding this, and extracts from her letter are as follows:-

Dear Volunteer Scouts,

....the success of the news-letter delivery scheme has been entirely due to the commitment of all the volunteers concerned. To those of you Scouts who have been with us from the begining and those who joined along the line we extend a hearty and heartfelt thanks.

....we particularly appreciate the feedback we have had from some of you from your visits...and from these helpful comments we have been able to do a great deal to help the blind....it would be helpful if you would differentiate clearly between comments made by the blind out of interest and requests by them for us to take action....We also need to be sure that the blind person has agreed to us being asked to become involved on his or her behalf.

....we are most anxious to have the reactions to the sample of large print in the last issue.... people do not always take in everything at once when it is read to them and large print may enable some of them to refer back for details....(<u>Leaders</u>: <u>please ask your boys</u> to report their findings on this matter to you, and then pass it on to me so that I can forward the information to Mrs Fenton. John Baker)....

It will also be helpful to us if you will let us know promptly if we are overloading you with new cases....we can always cut particular lists down...

..when lists are being reorganised let us know if you have particular persons you would like to keep on your round....our aim is to maintain continuity for the recipients.

<u>In conclusion, thank you again, Scouts,</u> for giving your time and interest. Do remember that we can meet the cost of out of pocket expenses (travelling, postage, telephone calls) incurred in helping us to help the blind.
