# ARTS & CRAFTS 1985 & MUSIC FESTIVAL

<u>Details of the Art, and Crafts Competition</u> for 1985 have not yet been received for inclusioa in this Co-Ordinator, but it is hoped that some information will be forthcoming which can be attached as an appendix.

However, here are the details of the Music and Entertainment Section:-

#### Classes in Music & Entertainment Section.

ME1: PIANOFORTE SOLO.

ME2: VOCAL SOLO, ACCOMPANIED.

ME3: STRING SOLO, ACCOMPANIED. (GUITARS UN-ACCOMPANIED)

ME4: BRASS or SILVER SOLO, ACCOMPANIED.

ME5: WOOD WIND SOLO, ACCOMPANIED. (NOT RECORDERS)

ME6: RECORDER SOLO.

ME7: CHOIR SINGING, Minimum 6 voices, classical, church, Traditional, etc.

ME8: CHORUS SINGING, Minimum 6 voices, Pop, Camp Fire Songs, Choruses etc.

ME9: ANY STAGE ENTERTAINMENT, by 2 or more boys; this item covers playlets,

short sketches, musical items etc., which

do not qualify for inclusion in ME1 to ME8.

ME10: RECITATION: NOTE, PLEASE SUPPLY A PROMPTER FOR THIS ITEM.

### RULES FOR MUSICE ENTERTAINMENT SECTION

- 1. Entries must be received by Wednesday 20th. February 1985, on official entry form, by John Baker, 47 Highfield, Letchworth, SG6 3PY.
- 2. No item entered in previous competitions will be accepted.
- 3. <u>Type of entry to be shown</u> on entry form eg: 'Violin' 'Cornet' 'Viola' 'Flute' 'Piano Solo' etc.
- 4. <u>Solo items to be accompanied</u> except where otherwise stated above, to provide uniformity of judging.
- 5. No item to exceed 4 mins total presentation time. (Recorders 2 mins.)

- 6. All music to be provided by competitors -
- 7. John Baker will accompany where required. Rehearsals by arrangement.
- 8. A HI-Fi System will be available for playing Tapes or Records.
- 9. All entries to be on official entry form. (Copies attached further copies available from John Baker).
- 10. If insufficient entries are received for any class, or for the whole competition, entries may be transferred to another class, or the class cancelled, or the whole competition cancelled.
- 11. Details of the times the various items will take place will be worked out when entries are received. Entrants, or their Leaders, should telephone John Baker on Letchworth 4782 on or after Sunday February 24th. for details. It is hoped that programmes will be available for collection from 47 Hi ghfield by the same date.
- 12. Trophies will be awarded as follows:-

THE ADLAM TROPHY:

for the Peck which produces the 'most entertaining' item, as judged by the independent adjudicator.

THE NORTON TROPHY:

for the Troop which produces the 'most entertaining' item, as judged by the independent adjudicator.

THE JOHN BAKER MUSIC TROPHY for the individual Cub or Scout who displays the highest degree of technical skill, gives good entertainment value, and shows the most potential in the opinion of the adjudicator.

13. Points will be awarded as follows:-

4 points. First place: Second place: 3 points. Third place: 2 points.

Highly commended: 1 point. (Note: If less than 3 entries in a class, the adjudicator may award Highly commended in lieu of a 1st. 2nd. or 3rd., if he considers this justified.)

14. No adults allowed on stage during; performances.
