SAVE TAX ON YOUR FUNDS...

Changes in the way tax will be applied to monies held in Deposit Accounts at Banks have already been given in the media. From the beginning of the forthcoming Taxyear, tax will be deducted by the Bank on the interest gained on any money you hold on Deposit accounts, and your interest will therefore be paid net unless you take action to recover the tax on behalf of your Group.

To recover the Tax a letter, on official Scout Headed paper, must be sent to the appropriate bank stating that the Deposit Account in which your money is held is a 'Scout Association' account, and as the Scout Association is a Registered Charity you require to be paid in full, without any tax deductions.

The same arrangement applies to any interest on money you hold in a Building Society account belonging to your Group.

<u>Send your letter</u> to your Group's Bank (or Building Society if you have not already done so) as soon as you have reed this, any delay may loose you interest as no retrospective refunds can be made.

MUSIC & ENTERTAINMENT FESTIVAL+ COMPETITION.


