Most people in Scouting in our District are only really aware of the District Treasurer at the end of March and early April, because that is subscription time. Well, that's life!

In fact, he has quite a busy year, which just happens to start on All Fools Day, which is very convenient, as it coincides with lots of other organisations and, of course, the Tax Year as run by Great Britain Limited. The first real event in the DT's year is his election at the Annual Meeting of the District Scout Council, when two officers and up to six members are elected. Then he gets to work.

During the course of the year, various projects come up for consideration at the District Executive Committee which have to be costed and, if approved, funds made available. Of course, if it is a big scheme, then plans will be laid in good time to raise the extra money needed before it has to be spent. To help with this, towards the end of the working year a budget is drawn up of the District's money needs for the next year. This helps the DEC to decide the rate for the District Subscription.

The last major job in the year is to draw up the accounts for the past year in the form of a balance sheet for approval by the Annual Meeting of the District Scout Council.

As the annual subscription is the main source of income for the DEC, it represents the start of the financial year, so the DT is naturally very keen to receive them all as early in April as possible before the Annual Meeting. Besides these jobs for the DEC, the DT may be asked for advice by Group Treasurers on financial matters, such as fund raising.

All this adds up to quite a busy time, so please spare a thought for your DT at the end of March and early April each year!

CANOE COURSES FOR SCOUTS, LEADERS, INSTRUCTORS, ETC. LETCHWORTH OUTDOOR POOL AND RIVER GREAT OUSE.

TWO TYPES OF COURSE WILL BE RUN AS FOLLOWS:-

COURSE A: Designed for beginners. Dealing with elementary skills and leading to The British Canoe

Fee: Union (BCU) 1 Star Award, which is the requirement for the Elementary Canoist Scout

£7.50. Proficiency Badge.

<u>COURSE B:</u> For those with, or capable of BCU 1 Star. Consists of more advanced skills and rescue techniques up to BCU 2 Star, which is the requirement for a Scout Canoe Charge Certificate.

Courses A and B will consist of three pool sessions of approx. 50 minutes each, held on Monday nights, plus a river training session and a river test session on the River Ouse. These will be held over a weekend and the tests will be conducted by Instructors and/or Senior Instructors of the BCU.

<u>A & B fees include:</u> Use of equipment, pool fees, bades and certificates (if successful). It does not include transport to and from any of the sessions.
