During 1994, the Scout Association is raising money to help Ugandan Scouts and UNICEF. In order to do this effectively the Scout Association has adopted a project 'UNITE for Uganda' for this year. The aims of the project are to support Scouts in Uganda in their work against disease. The Scout Association has produced a series of books to promote the idea of Unite. There is a book for each section which is full of programme ideas geared for that age group. There is also a badge that everyone is entitled to wear on their uniform during 1994.

lst. Baldock (Templars) Cub pack have been trying out some of the suggestions in their pack evenings recently :-

One evening was spent looking at the composition of the Ugandan flag, and also at the countries of Africa as well as the Districts of Uganda. The boys coloured in copies of the flag and completed word searches drawn out in the shape of Africa and Uganda. Some boys also tried to piece together a jigsaw of the district of Uganda.

Another evening was spent thinking about immunisation, use of water and health in general. We thought about how we take these things for granted in England and how Ugandan people can't. A game was played to try and get across to the boys how immunisation against disease can save lives.

A third evening has been spent making tribal masks - in Ugandan villages people often wear masks for special ceremonies and dances. At the end of the evening the boys tried some Ugandan food - Peanut Loaf, sweet potatoes, tapioca and sweets (made from icing sugar, coconut and mashed sweet potatoes) the sweets were the most popular until the boys were told what they were made from !!! The boys have also been given some monkey nuts to try and grow at home - hopefully we will see some results in a few months time.

The next session we will be doing will be comparing our homes to those that Ugandans live in, and the boys will try to make a model of a Ugandan village of mud huts.
