We are much saddened by the untimely death of Dave Liddle on February 4th. aged 50 years whilst on holiday in Australia.

Dave was the Chief Engineer at Fairfield Hospital and joined 11th. Letchworth as Scout Leader in 1980 where he continued until the end of 1988. During his leadership the Troop grew in size and reputation, having considerable success in both District and County Events whilst about a dozen scouts gained the Chief Scouts Award.

Dave was a devoted family man and he and his second wife Hazel, provided a loving home for their son Robert and Hazels sans Richard, Andrew and Chris from her first marriage. Andrew and Chris both became successful scouts and Robert became an enthusiastic Cub Scout under the leadership of Hazel who was a much respected District Akela.

When Dave left Letchworth in 1988 it was to be Warden at Buckmore in Kent and from there he progressed to be Warden at Walesby Scout Centre where he served for the last five years of his life.

His funeral took place on Monday 20th. February at Mansfield Crematorium attended by his family and many, many friends including representatives from 11th. Letchworth and the District.

AUTHORISATION FOR ADVENTUROUS ACTIVITIES - NEW PROPOSALS.

So far as the individual seeking authorisation is concerned, he or she will still be authorised by the District Commissioner (or the County/Area Commissioner if appropriate) acting on technical advice from the relevant County/Area Adviser. In those cases in which the applicant does hold a formal qualification, it will be necessary in future to provide a photocopy of the relevant certificate(s). There will still be an initial local assessment of the applicants general personal suitability carried out by the responsible Group Scout Leader (if applicable) and the District Commissioner. As now, this local Assessment will have no technical element to it.

The County/Area Adviser will then carry out an assessment of the applicants technical suitability on the basis of the material submitted by the applicant, personal knowledge of the applicant, and, if required by the County/Area Adviser, a practical assessment, This assessment, the provision for which is new, will be of the applicants personal technical competence in the activity, and his/her competence to lead, and to instruct young people at an appropriate level in the the activity, and of his/her competence in carrying out the activity with a group of young people.

The arrangements for these practical assessments will need careful local consideration if a necessary reform is not to become an unnecessary bottleneck, but if we are to have the confidence in our authorisations which is now called for, a County/Area Adviser must be able to require a practical assessment when he or she judges that it is necessary. In most Counties/Areas, it should prove relatively straightforward to plan opportunities for 'routine' water activities assessments, most of which will probably relate to sailing and /or canoeing. Assessments for single pitch climbing and abseiling should also be similarly straightforward. We recognise, however, that for English Counties remote from the hills the arranging of assessments for hillwalking is likely to mean planning one or two extra week-ends away.

As now, the authorisation itself will be issued locally by the District Commissione: It will be subject to review at intervals of not more than five years, and may be reviewed at any time on the request of the applicant, or if required by the Distric Commissioner. Authorisations will almost always be limited to specified levels of activity, and may be restricted in terms of location, weather conditions, time of year etc. An authorised person must have emergency aid training relevant and appropriate to his or her activity and level of authorisation. The provision for all authorisations to be reviewed is new (although most existing authorisations have been subject to review), and the existing review period of three years has been varied to a maximum of five years. It will obviously be appropriate to issue some authorisations for shorter periods this will be a matter for local discretion.
