World Scout Jamboree 1998 - 99

The 19th World Jamboree took place in Piraquin, Chile (60km South of Santiago) next to the foot hills of the Andes. The view was something that cannot be described in either words or with photographs, you had to be there.

Having finally finished the gruelling flights, which lasted about 24 hours in total (with stopovers), we boarded a coach and set off on the five hour journey to the camp. We arrived in the afternoon at our sub camp Chibchos and using up our last dregs of energy we set up the camp, found the supermarket then ate dinner. At about midnight Tony Morrison (the contingent leader) said "paperwork time" and a large groan was heard throughout the Jamboree Site.

After not a lot of sleep we got up at 7.00 am for breakfast and the day was used to finish off setting up the camp and making our camp entrance gate which took four hours. The previous evening had been used as a greeting session where myself, Dale and Neil were up until 3.00 am just saying Hola! to everybody we met and chatting to the other British Scouts. The next day was all opening ceremony and Sharon (another Leader with our contingent) invited everybody to get up at 6.00 am to join her for a run (and every morning after that), but

I decided not to indulge myself choosing the evening for a couple of laps around the central shopping area. The opening ceremony was not one for the Scouts but more orientated to the viewers watching which was great because we got to catch up on some sleep. Lots of singing and dancing to 'Swing Low Sweet Chariot' and 'Rule Britannia' followed and we all managed to loose our voices.

The following morning everybody signed up for the peace badge and joined various international patrols. Over the following days we used various activity bases as part of the peace badge and went on a trip to a manure manufacturing farm, to learn about non chemical fertilisers and their benefits.

Everybody had a good time and we were sad to leave the Jamboree. On the last day there was a kit and address swap and final goodbyes.

Next on our tour of South America was Argentina for Home Hospitality. This was the part that I was most nervous about. I felt as if I was going to be imposing on someone's hospitality. I knew very little of their customs but it turned out very well. In our four days there we visited most of Rosairo including the flag monument and we met the mayor.

The World Jamboree's something that nobody who went will ever forget because it was just so good. I would recommend it to any Scout who wishes to go in the future.

Many thanks to all those who helped to make it possible for us to attend and to the District Team for being so supportive.




