# THREE VALLEYS WATER SCOUT VISITS TO CLAY LANE

Three Valleys Water has built an Environmental Education centre set in 35 acres of woodland at the Clay Lane Treatment Works. It was officially opened by Dr David Ballamy in September 1998. It is expected that the centre will attract up to 10,000 visitors each year including school children and youth groups from the Three Valleys area and beyond undertaking a range of activities.

These include pond dipping, looking at bird life, invertebrate work, water box experiments and tours of the water treatment works, (for 7 years and older). The water experiments are National Curriculum based science experiments at key stages 1 and 2 and provide fun ways of learning about water.


We have already had a number of Scout Groups visiting the centre and the water treatment works for the "Water Wise" badge and have completed work on the Naturalist badge for the 15th Bushey and Oxhey Scout group, but we are keen to develop activities suitable for individual groups needs.

As a non-profit making centre we charge £2 per child with adults and helpers free. There is a minimum charge of £25 but we can cope with groups up to 64.



We recently went to a Sikh Temple in Hitchin called a Gurudwara. The Gurdwara is a funny place, when you get inside you have to take your shoes off. 

Inside the temple there is a kitchen called the Largar where they served us with cola and pastries. We liked the food they gave us. People go there to talk and meet each other






