PEOPLE IN LETCHWORTH





The MBE has been awarded for his services to local Scouting and Guiding and the Royal Naval Association.

In years gone by he was an active Scout Leader and helped his wife with Guides. Since his retirement as a leader he has organised adult support for Scouting through the Scout Fellowship, who have made him President of the Letchworth & Baldock District Scout Fellowship. He has helped build an extension for the Guide's Headquarters and he has become known throughout the District for his annual plant stall which has raised thousands of pounds over the years for local charities.

Laurie is a very popular person who is respected for his commitment and enthusiasm. He is extremely community minded and the only reward he seeks is the satisfaction and acknowledgement of those he helps.

October 16th is the AGM and we are hoping to get John Bennett to give a talk on the time he spent in the Seychelles.


December we are hoping to arrange a wine tasting.


NORTON BURY


Later a choice from the Fish & Chip Shop. The evening was rounded off with some old and new camp fire songs. (All were asleep by 10.30pm)







SCOUTS & GUIDES MILLENNIUM CAMP NORTON BURY


The Millennium Camp will be held over the weekend of 26th - 29th May 2000.

NIGHTJAR

Exercise NIGHTJAR, Letchworth and Baldock District Scouts' night hiking competition, will take place on the night of the 15th/16th October 1999.

The event will take the form of a timed hike along footpaths, designed to test navigational and timekeeping skills, plus a series of "incidents" that will challenge the team's ability to solve typical scouting problems. Points will be lost for poor-time keeping (arriving at a checkpoint before or after the designated time), and will be scored for performance during the "incidents".

The event is open to teams from all troops in the District and is in two classes: Junior (all team members under 13 years of age on the night), and Senior (all team members under 15 1/2 on the night). Junior teams may be accompanied by an adult leader, or registered helper; provided that they do not assist the team (except in the case of emergency). All team members must be invested in that troop's Scout section. The time-keeping requirements will be stricter for senior teams, and they will walk a longer route: otherwise the event will be the same for both classes.

It is expected that if a troop enters a team, they will also provide two adults to assist with the running of the event.

More information, including entry forms will be available prior to the summer break. In the meantime, if you have any questions, contact Gareth Howell on 01462 677090.
