

What is the problem?

Over the past few years in Hertfordshire, nearly 40% of the Cub Scouts have not made it into Scouts. This is a great shame - especially for the young people concerned.

In some Groups the link between Cub Scouts and Scouts works really well, and this is good news. In other Groups, we think that the link might need a bit of a helping hand.



The "Going Up" project is designed to promote the link between the Cub Scout and Scout Sections. It should be a bit of fun for the Cub Scouts and Scouts and we hope that it will make the transition process easier for young people and for Leaders.

The scheme is really simple and consists of two parts:

GOING UP BOOKLET

This is used to record and drive the linking process. It is filled in by the Cub Scout, the Scouts and the Leaders - so that everyone is involved. Older Cub Scouts should be given the pack as they start the linking process (about four to six weeks before they finally move from the Pack to the Troop)

CERTIFICATE

Every Cub Scout who successfully links will receive a certificate from the Assistant County Commissioner (Cub Scouts). To get the certificate, send in the form at the back of the "Going Up Booklet".

CENSUS 31st JANUARY 2000

The next census will soon be on us so now is the time to start collecting the necessary information. As explained in the Scout Association paper, "The National Cost of Supporting Scouting" which has been circulated to all Leaders, the National Subscription will be £12.50 per head with additions for the County and District.


Membership cards will not be issued next year. On the other hand, the requirement that names and addresses should be recorded at local level has begun to prove its worth, and will be continued. The reasons are:-

- 1. the proper maintenance of records for child protection
- 2. the need for 'auditable' census returns
- 3. the need to 'debug' the system for the time when a proper database becomes possible
- 4. the need to be able to answer specific queries when certain sorts of incident occur.

8th Letchworth Cubs Sleepover


Saturday 10th July

The list of activities was endless some of the best being, sailing, skiing, quad biking, pot holing, canoeing and archery.










GOING FOR GROWTH
