

# Millennium Volunteers

Millennium Volunteers is a new initiative to encourage 16 –24 years old to volunteer their time for the benefit of others.

It is designed to empower young people to undertake activity on local issues which they really care about using their skills and interests as a stating point.

All young people can participate, whether at school, in further or higher education, employed and unemployed and from different backgrounds and abilities.

Young people are expected to complete two hundred hours of voluntary activities spread out over a year. What they decide to do and how they plan to go about doing it will be set out in a Volunteer Plan. Young people will be equal stakeholders in the design and delivery of the voluntary activity they are involved in.

A combination of self-assessment, peer review and external evaluation will ensure the quality of the volunteering opportunities.

Millennium Volunteers Awards will recognise young people's achievements and commitment. The MV award of Excellence, signed by the Secretary of State, will mark the completion of the Volunteer Plan and 200 hours of voluntary activity. The MV Certificate will be a building block recognising 100 hours of voluntary activity. Young people will have the opportunity to access formal accreditation for their learning on Millennium Volunteers if they wish, for example to pursue Key Skills qualifications.

Have you ever walked with a Ruc-Sac full of equipment? Don't wait until you get to Scotland to find out.


#### Will I Be With My Mates
