The Queen's Golden Jubilee Procession, London 4 June 2002

100 Adult Volunteers Sought

Once again The Scout Movement has been asked to assist with a high-profile state event. Volunteers are being sought to spend a very long and very arduous day assisting the team responsible for the huge Jubilee Parade in Central London and also the associated activities in the Royal Parks. Fifty are required to assist the team of stage managers in the formation and co-ordination of the six large groups participating in the Queen's Procession. A further fifty are required to help distribute water supplies.

You will need to be aged 18+ and unless you are very fit—probably not more than about 50. The day will be long, tiring and will involve a lot of walking and standing. You will need to have patience, common sense and the ability to follow instructions often under considerable pressure. It will, however, be a small moment in history.

Initial Hill Walking Course / Intermediate Mountaineering Course - Lochearnhead, Easter 2002



Over the Easter week, three leaders from Letchworth and Baldock: Gareth Howell, Fiona Potts and Stephanie Williams; plus two Venture Scouts: Nick Howell and Stephen Woolmer, attended the IMC at Lochearnhead Scout Station. Over forty other Scouts and Leaders from Hertfordshire also attended, together with approximately thirty instructors, assistants and helpers. Some of the younger scouts were on the IHC.

Attendees are split into parties of four or five, based on ability, and follow a course of instruction in the skills required to make the best of the Scottish mountains in summer. A separate course, the Advanced Mountaineering Course, covers winter skills.

Over the course of the week, we went on four separate day hikes, aimed at improving skills and personal fitness and took part in a three day expedition; camping at altitude in the wild. For some this was their first experience of wild camping.

In my case, our party camped in Inverlochlarig Glen and climbed Stob Binnein, Stob Garbh and Beinn Tulaichean over the two days We also spent time improving our micro navigation and rope handling skills.

We did find some snow to practice with our ice axes. When we climbed Meal nan Tarmachan, we needed our ice axes to help us up a 100ft near vertical climb on snow. Imagine climbing a 100ft loft ladder and you will get some idea.

The week ended with the traditional end of course dinner and entertainment.

The IHW is aimed at Scouts from the age of 13 upwards and is an excellent introduction to mountaineering. The IMC is really aimed at older Scouts and Venture Scouts, and at adults. If you love the mountains, or even if you are just curious, I can strongly recommend both the IHW and the IMC as a way of gaining experience and having a great deal of fun.






Membership Subscription 2003

Residential Events

Now that the season of residential events/activities is upon us, it is very important to remember the following when making any plans –

Beaver Sleepovers must have a minimum of three adults at all times, one of which must be a warranted Leader, with a ratio of one adult to every four Beaver Scouts, plus one additional adult in charge.

For all Cub Scout residential events, there must be one adult to every six Cub Scouts, excluding the Leader in charge. The Leader in charge must be warranted and have completed the appropriate training.

For Scout and Explorer camps there are no supervision rules although the Leadership Team and the District Commissioner should be aware of the arrangements.

A PC form should be completed for all Beaver Sleepovers, Cub Camps/Pack Holidays, and Scout Camps over 4 nights duration.
