ScoutCount Software: Advice to Members

Members who have purchased the 'Scouting Essential' manual for the Programme will know that an addition to the package is a CD-ROM. This contains a considerable amount of information and graphics extending from images of all new Badges to a complete version of the latest Policy Organisation and Rules (POR).

Included on the CD-ROM is a record keeping database called ScoutCount. Experience has revealed that the software contains a number of bugs causing error and creating difficulties for users.

Expert advice has shown that the most practical way forward is to have the software professionally rewritten - subjected to a vigorous testing and evaluation phase - and then made available as ScoutCount Version 2.

It is the intention that this upgraded program will be made available free of charge in the Spring 2003. This will probably be done via the ScoutbaseUK website and/or replacement CD-ROM.

Owners of version 1 may wish to continue using the current programme and it is possible that some of the data from this may be transferable but this is not guaranteed so users may wish to continue to use their current record keeping systems.

### Q. How many times can a young person in the Beavers, Cubs or Scouts attain any one of the Challenge Awards?

**A.** There is no limit to the number of times a young person can do a particular challenge as long as they do a harder challenge if they redo one. However, you should remember that the Programme is a balanced one and the young people should be doing all the challenges available for the section. The other point to consider is whether the young person would have time during their time in a section to do three or four of the same challenge.


