



I deliberately set out to make this the easiest NightJar ever. I have been involved in NightJars where teams have gone hopelessly wrong. Not this time! Using the new Explorer version maps; carefully choosing the route; using only bridleways, farm tracks and very minor roads and giving each base instructions to assist the teams with navigation. Nobody would get seriously lost. And guess what? Wrong!! Nobody did.

There were points out of 20 for arriving at the base on time. Dead to the minute gets 20; one minute late or early gets 19 two minutes wrong gets 18. Points for on base activity out of 10. With 5 bases and a starting point that was a maximum possible score of 160. The winning team scored 145. Proof that if you make the route clear and give clear instructions then they are not hopeless.

Not that it was that easy. Walking 15k at one o'clock in the morning is not easy. Keeping quiet past remote houses, blisters, freezing cold, upside down maps...





<u>Change of name</u> - application has been made to the Charity Commission to change the Norton Bury name to Wymondley Wood from 1st January 2003






