







St George's Day Parade and Service

This year's St George's Day Parade and Service will take place on Sunday 25 April 2004 at St George's Church, Norton Way North, Letchworth Garden City.

The parade will assemble at the Howard Hall car park (near the Paddling Pool) at 2.15 pm for a 2.30 pm prompt start. The parade will march along Rushby Mead, turning into Birds Hill and then along Norton Way North to the Church.

After the service the parade will reform and march down Norton Way North turning onto Norton Common by the side MacFadyen Webb House. The parade will be dismissed on Norton Common between 3.45 pm and 4.00 pm when the young people can be collected.

There will be refreshments for Leaders and Guests in the Culow Room, church hall after the parade has been dismissed.

Pheidippides, of course, was that ancient Greek, who ran all the 26 miles to Athens with the news of the victory at Marathon. But at least he only had to run. Letchworth and Baldock Senior Scouts, who tackled "Operation Pheidippides" on a Sunday afternoon in October 1965 had tasks, puzzles and problems to solve at seven checkpoints in seven miles. They had transport problems too. The first stage from Ashwell to Claybush Hill, had to be done on bicycles; the next stage to Bygrave required roller skates - which many of the competitors had not worn for years. The next two miles to Baldock were footslogging, and then through the town a wheelbarrow or pram was required, changing over near the Astonia for soapbox trolleys, mostly borrowed from younger brothers in the Cubs! Boy Scouts from each group provided help as "pit crews" and had those bikes waiting in fine trim at Letchworth Gate for the last sprint to Willian Pond - but not quite the last stage. This was the dramatic climax, with each team hastily constructing some sort of raft and hoping to get across the water. Not all succeeded. Finally the "entry card" (written on a yard of wallpaper had to be handed in un-torn and unfolded.)

As well as stamina and nerve a good deal of preparatory organization was a deciding factor in Operation Pheidippides. 1st Baldock Senior Scout troop proved themselves District champions by taking the first three places. Winners where Christopher Anderson and Robert Wilsher (508 points) followed by Michael Hoeg and Keiron Jones (503.5) and David Emery and Robert Hilditch (502).

5th Letchworth Senior Scouts Roger Cooper and Robert Wilson gained 405 points and Martien Lafferty and Colin McEwen earned 373 for Second Letchworth.

Dear Dave and Rita

Well I can't believe that its almost a month since we left Baldock, so before I regale you with life in Wales please could you pass on my sincere thanks to everyone in the District for the lovely engraved vase and all the good wishes we received on our departure. I thoroughly enjoyed my Scouting with you all and thank you for all the opportunities I had.

I have met with the Area (County) Commissioner, Ken Hinton, and apparently he had already had a chat with Roger, so knew a fair bit about me already.

In the Caerphilly District (equates to an area equivalent to Baldock, Letchworth and Hitchin) there are only four Scout groups! Caerphilly is part of Mid Glamorgan Area (County), which is made up of eight Districts, across which there are only fifty one Scout Groups.

There is some restructuring planned with the County/Area over the next 3-6 months, so in the short term I have been given an appointment of "County Scouter" and will be working as part of the Area's training team. I will be meeting with the Area Training Manager within the next week or so. They are not as far advance with the new Adult Scheme as Hertfordshire, so should be an interesting to see how they intend transferring over to the new scheme. I am also hoping to rejoin the Fellowship, but in the whole of Mid Glamorgan there is only one Scout Fellowship.

Congratulations on the 500th edition of Coordinator. I can remember the first edition back in 1959.

I was in 3rd Letchworth then and my father was an Assistant Cub Master with 4th Letchworth. Little did I know that when the 4th Letchworth Rover Crew became the nucleus to revitalise the Letchworth District Rover Crew in 1965 that I would be apart of the team that produced Co-ordinator on the first Sunday of each month. Apart from addressing envelopes, it was my job to take the envelopes to the Post Office in the Broadway on my way home, even then we still delivered some by hand.

I remember many of the District events mentioned, Bank Holiday weekends spent on Norton common, I was a member of the first District expedition to Lochearnhead lead by Jeff Robson in 1964 and also the opening of Norton Bury.

Reading the names in the District Honours brought to mind even more memories of folk who had helped me through my Scouting career. Chris Flemming, Lawrence Sapsed and Jonathan Savage who was in 3rd Letchworth with Gerard Yates who became my Assistant Scout Leader 4th Letchworth. Leslie Brown and his wife who kept Cubs a float in the mid-1950's. And getting my father involved Peter Norton while he was District Commissioner while smoking his pipe passing on his advice so freely and whose son was a member of my Scout Troop.

All that is left for me to say is thank you for rekindling the memories of my time spent in your District which stemmed from 1954 to 1977.
