



Nights Away Permit and Notification

As you are aware the National Nights Away Permit Scheme came into operation on the 1st September 2004.

This means some new rules have to be observed before you can take young people away overnight.

The Leader planning to take young people away must hold the appropriate Nights Away Permit for the event they are intending to undertake.

There are three categories of permit

- · Indoor
- Campsite
- · Greenfield

all of which can have restrictions placed on them by the District Nights Away Advisors or the District Commissioner.

If you do not hold a permit then you can no longer be permitted to take young people away overnight, unless you are accompanied by a leader holding the appropriate permit.

Up until the end of September you can apply for a permit under the "Fast Track " system. You will need to complete the Nights Away Permit Application form and send it complete with written evidence of at least two years experience of either planning /leading or being part of the leadership team of events for the category of permit you are applying for.

This should be sent to the District Nights Away Advisors, Sheila and Edmond Tickner.

If you do not have the necessary experience then you will need to complete Module 16 Nights Away Dates of courses can be found on the County website www.herts-scouts.net and are booked via County Office. Please also inform Sheila, Edmond or myself when you book.

Once you have completed the course then your first camp or sleepover will be assessed and your permit issued.

When you book a campsite you will be asked for your permit number (within Hertfordshire) or a copy of your permit, both sides, (outside Hertfordshire) before your booking can be confirmed.

Not less than seven days before going away to a Scout run facility or not less than fourteen days to any other facility a completed Nights Away Notification form (NAN) must be sent to the District Commissioner

Explorer Scouts Czech it Out

Letchworth and Baldock based Oak Eagle Explorer Scout Unit have just returned from a 10-day expedition to the Czech Republic. This was the Unit's first major expedition since their formation in January 2003. Twenty young people, aged between 14 and 16 years (6 girls and 14 boys) along with four Leaders were based in the small town of LETY, which is approximately 25km's south west of the capital city, Prague. During their time in the Republic they undertook many exciting activities including white water rafting, rock climbing, mountain biking, adventure trails and numerous trips to swim in the river Berounka close to their base.

Added to these challenging activities were a visit to the famous Karlstejn Castle and a day spent sightseeing and shopping in Prague. To add to their challenges most of the journeys were undertaken on the local trains so their resourcefulness was constantly tested to ensure they caught the right train in the right direction, a feat they managed to achieve without any hitches.

To emphasise the International nature of the Scout movement, the coach used to travel to the Czech Republic was shared with a Group of Irish Venture Scouts and while there they hosted an evening at their base for a Group of Dutch Scouts they met whilst swimming and to round off the expedition they spent an evening with a local Czech Scout troop playing games and cooking over an open fire.
