Young Leaders and what you need to know

To all Adult Leaders

You can officially enlist the services of Young People between the ages of 14 and 18 years as helpers within your Colony, Pack or Troop or Group provided that they are either:

A member of the Oak Eagle E.S.U - Young Leaders' Unit.

A member of another Explorer Scout Unit.

Carrying out the service element of the Duke of Edinburgh award scheme for an agreed length of time.

In all these cases and **especially item 3**, the Young Person must be registered with the Oak Eagle E.S.U – Young Leaders' Unit in order to ensure we meet all the necessary requirements of the Scout Association. This can be done by contacting the District Explorer Scout Commissioner, who will then come and talk to the individual, explain the role and responsibilities and officially register them on the Young Leaders' Unit books.

All Young People undertaking a role as a Young Leader will need to complete Module A – Prepare for Take Off, of the Young Leaders training plan. This Module identifies and discusses the purpose of Scouting, POR and the Yellow Card. On completion of this element the Explorer Scout will be issued with his or her Young Leaders Badge. This training will be organised by the District Explorer Scout Commissioner.

When a young person undertaking the Duke of Edinburgh award scheme has completed their required period of service, they have the option, if they so wish, of continuing as a Young Leader. In order to do this they **must** become a member of a Young Leaders Explorer Unit.

If you have any Young People helping you within your section who do not fall into one of these 3 categories, we need to ensure that they understand the need to become an official member of the Scout Association or that they must cease to attend your meetings.
