

The Centre will act as a focal point for local schools undertaking conservation/environmental studies sponsored by the Letchworth Garden City Heritage Foundation. The nature trails and educational materials will be available to all visitors. We are pleased to welcome other groups such as the Duke of Edinburgh Awards and Sea Cadets.

During the year a wet weather shelter has been erected and good progress is being made on the "lean-to" which will provide additional storage.

The archery range is a major addition to our facilities and other activity equipment such as a trampoline and bouncy castle has been purchased.

The Management Committee would like to thank everyone who has contributed to these developments and the day-to-day management of the Centre. Our thanks also go to the Wardens for their commitment to the smooth running of the Centre and ensuring that our visitors enjoy their stay with us.



# St George's Day

Sermon given by Rev. Seamus Murphy

A few moments ago we were reminded of why it is that we have all come here this afternoon, we said "we have come to worship God and honour our Patron, St George".

Much of the life of St George is shrouded in legends and stories about dragons etc, but what we do know for sure about him is that he was a martyr - that is, he was someone who suffered death rather than betray his religious beliefs. The word martyr means "witness" and so a martyr is someone who is prepared to stand up and give witness before other people for what he believes in: by his words and actions he tells other people about God's love for him and his love for God. He gives good example.

It is for this reason that all the branches of the Scout movement give special honour and devotion to our Patron, St George. We want to do the same as he did; we too want to be witnesses to God's love in everything we do; we want to give good example. It is true that we are all witnesses to God's love but the Scout is a witness in a special way; people know who you are; they know what you stand for and what they should expect from you and so you have a special responsibility.

I know that in all your different actions and the things that you do, Scouts are not just concerned about having a good time for themselves; I have been reading "the Co-ordinator, HSG and the Fifth Letchworth News" and I was very impressed by all the charitable works you do, not only locally but also by generously responding to the world's needs, such as the Tsunami appeal. Well done!

In a few moments time you will be making your promises; these are promises that we make to God Himself; we are a people who live by our words and so we don't make our promises carelessly nor lightly; we say what we mean and we mean what we say.

Many young people find that being a Christian nowadays is no easy matter, because of inexperience they can be exposed to many harmful influences. So often we are told human life is cheap and unimportant - we don't agree, for us all human life is precious and sacred in the sight of God. Sometimes young people are even laughed at and ridiculed by their own age group because they believe in God, say their prayers and practice their faith. Some find the easiest way is to follow the crowd; but to stand up for what you believe in and know to be right can be very difficult - to be a witness takes courage. It is here that you young people can do so much good by your example to others and especially in your own age groups. Each of you is very special in the sight of God and He has a special purpose, a special plan for each one of you. The important thing is that you discover that plan by using wisely and well the gifts and talents that He has given you. If you always have respect for yourselves and for the people you meet, then you will be following the example of St George - you too will be martyrs - witnesses before others of God's love for you and your live for God.
