A small number of presentations were made near the Terrace Steps. The Gentlemen at Arms formed lanes for the Queen and the Royal Family to move through the guests. The Queen stopped frequently to talk to individuals as she made her way to the Royal Tea Tent.

We then made our way to the large marquees erected for the event to be served drinks, finger sandwiches, cake and ice cream.

At 5.50pm the Queen and the Royal Family made their way back to the Palace occasionally stopping to chat to more of the guests. Once the Queen had reached the Terance Steps the band again played the National Anthem after which the Queen and the Royal Family went back inside the Palace.

This marked the end of a very enjoyable afternoon. To leave the garden we were taken through the State Rooms to the inner courtyard, where the Queen usually greets her visitors. From there we made our way to the outer courtyard, passing the guardsman in their bright red uniforms, on duty, and out through the main gate much to the bewilderment of the tourists gathered outside. It was a very enjoyable experience and one we will remember for years to come.
