
The first hill was a struggle but we got to the checkpoint, realising that we had not walked as a team for three years! We decided to ease the pace a little.

1st Baldock Knights had to wait a long time for their race. At one pint we thought that they had been




forgotten! However, with 20 teams altogether it was just taking a long time to get them through the course.
