### St George's Day Parade and Service - Sunday 20 April 2008

Over five hundred members of the District paraded from the Community Centre along the High Street to the Catholic Church in Limekiln Lane. The service was led by Father Andrew who ensured that there was audience participation by involving the congregation in his address.

The music was provided by the Stotfold Salvation Army and Philip Dean on the organ. The Scouts were joined by representatives of NHDC, LGCHF, Round Table and Rotary Club. The Scout County representative, Mick Edwards ACC (Scouts), commended the District on the high numbers attending and dismissed the parade after the service.

Refreshments were served in the Church Hall where Rob Hemmings GSL 1st Baldock cut the celebration cake on behalf of the Baldock Scouts.

#### Baldock Beavers Bounce for the Blind



The two colonies at 1st Baldock joined forces at the beginning of this year to raise money for the Guide Dogs for the Blind Association.



We kicked off the project with a joint meeting where we met Jan Gibson, her husband and a wonderful quide dog called Dipper. Jan told us all about how puppies are trained for about 20 months before they are placed with a visually-impaired person and how they then help them become more mobile and independent. We watched a video and all had a stroke of Dipper who

loved every minute of it!



Tuesday Beavers are lucky enough to have a member who is currently a Puppy Walker for GDBA - a family who looks after a puppy to get her used to all kinds of places, smells and noises before starting her more intensive training. Mrs Allerton told us about the training of Maudie and then we did things as if we were blind - one Beaver had to put batteries in a radio and turn it on while blindfolded!

Both colonies experienced finding out what it was like to rely on their other senses by such things as tasting crisps, identifying sounds and smells and feeling

different things in covered boxes - some nice, some gooey! Hardest of all, all the Beavers went, or were led, around a maze of obstacles, blindfolded. This showed just what trust you have to

have in your guide dog.

Everyone agreed that it was a worthwhile cause and sponsorship forms were distributed. In true Scouting tradition, the Beavers had 'Fun' with their 'Friends' whilst caring for others. We all got together on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> February for our Sponsored Bounce. Mums, Dads, brothers and sisters were all invited too. There were lots of stalls to enjoy such as Bash the Rat, Treasure Hunt, Hoop-a-frog and Guess the Name of the Dog. The main attraction, though, was the Bouncy Castle. It was a beautiful day (yes, in

### Safety Advisory Notice: Pierceable Gas Cartridges

Scout Insurance Services Limited monitors every accident notification made under Association rules. One of the reasons for this is to identify patterns or trends in order to inform and advise the Movement.

Over the last few years, there have been a number of serious incidents involving the use of gas cookers and lanterns which employ pierceable cartridges. Over the last ten years or so , the old pierceable cartridge has been superseded by lightweight aluminium cartridges which incorporate a screw or clip valve fitting. These can be fitted and removed repeatedly, with a minimal risk of the escape of gas. The main risks with the older type equipment are age, lack of familiarity and misuse.

The Scout Association is taking the unusual step in strongly advising Groups to cease using equipment which employ pierceable cartridges.

Groups are recommended to cease using such equipment and to implement a policy of replacement within twelve months at the latest.

### The Length of Service Award

After a review of the length of Service award a few changes have been made.

- 1. Awards are now available for 20 and 30 years service and awards are issued at five yearly intervals from 5 years to 30 years.
- 2. A certificate, together with an emblem or brooch for non uniformed will be issued with each 5, 10, 15, 20, 25, 30, 40, 50, 60 and 70 year award. The design of the emblem has changed slightly. It still follows the traditional pattern but with the figure of eight knot and number of years served in green in each case.

The new-style emblem and brooches will be issued form now.


