Many of the 1st Letchworth Scouts who met in a room above the front of Morrison's in The Broadway were also the Boys of Letchworth Morris Men Sword Dancers before the First World War. Jack Thompson at The Hive Printers in The Wynd printed many of The Morris Men Ring National Publications, English Folk Dance and Song Society and National Scout Literature. As a Boy Scout Jack was the block printer of the 1st Letchworth Scouts Newsletter 'The Yaffle' while he was also one of The Boys Sword Dance Team here in Letchworth . Jeff Robson and K.J. can tell you more of this.

I am now a member of Mendip Morris Men, Cambridge Morris Men and The Travelling Morris , and Fool to Whitchurch Morris Men and the Letchworth Morris Men. Over fourteen years ago I became Fool to The Squire of The Morris Ring (The Chief Scout of the organisation) presently Paul Reece of Thaxted Morris Men, who I help keep happy sometimes!
