The competition is an incident hike over a distance of eight and a half miles around the Welwyn area. Teams earn their points at various bases through a combination of teamwork and achievement. The threatened rain held off and the temperatures didn't fall too far. In fact perfect conditions.

This year bases consisted of amongst other things a wheelbarrow obstacle course, rope swing and go carts. It was really hard work but the Scouts remained enthusiastic and all the District teams managed to complete the course.

Back in the last century, when CO-ORDINATOR first appeared as a single black-and-white typed sheet, it was produced as a service to the District by the Rover

were omitted merely to save on shoulder tapes.) Prominent in the Crew, and an expert at turning the hand of the duplicating machine, was Maxwell Vines, who eventually gained the high rank of Assistant Rover Scouts Leader, or ARSL as it was pronounced with care and affection.


