Over 450 Young People and Leaders assembled in "the donkey field" in Ashwell on Sunday afternoon ready for our annual St George's Day parade, which this year was hosted by Ashwell Scout Group.

The parade was headed by the three District Standards and lead by Chris King and our local M.P., Mr Oliver Heald and his wife. We brought the village to a stand still as we made our way to St Mary's church. Our short service was hosted by the Reverend Dr Simon Chambers, vicar of St.Mary's. The vicar is no stranger to Scouting, his previous parish contained Brownsea Island, the birthplace of Scouting.

The church was filled to bursting point with very little standing room left. During the service we renewed our Promise and we were entertained by readings and a play by the Ashwell Beavers, Cubs and Scouts and accompanied during the hymns by the Salvation Army Band. The parade then headed back to Ashwell School where it was dismissed. It was a glorious afternoon, many invited guests and dignitaries attended the service and joined us for a cup of tea at the finish. Our local Councillors and M.P. were very impressed with the turnout and behaviour. They thought it a great advert for Scouting and all the good things it does for the Young People.

District Cub Scout 6-a-side Football Competition 28 March 2009

On March 28 the District Cub Six a Side football event was held at Lordship Farm School, Letchworth. Rather than playing indoors to guarantee the weather it had been decided that we would risk the vagaries of the British weather in March and play on the school field instead. Luckily, even though it was occasionally cold in the wind, the rain did hold off until everything had finished and had been packed away, then the heavens opened and decided to give us a fantastic hailstone storm!

We had seven teams entered who played a total 42 games between each other in a round robin event. Each team had a minimum squad of 6 and a maximum squad of ten and so it was estimated that at least fifty Cubs from the District played in the tournament. After the first few games most team managers had decided that it was better to play with the slope away from the school rather than up the slope and so great discussions then arose as to whose turn it was to play with the slope in the next game.

After four hours of football we had a tournament winner who were 2nd Baldock who managed to win four and draw two of their six matches without conceding a single goal!

They now have the privilege of representing the District at the County Six a Side football event in Chorleywood on 10 May.

Whilst the Cubs were playing football the parents and other supporters spent their time eating bacon rolls that had been cooked by CubJam Leaders and 12th Letchworth parents as a fundraiser for both. In fact the bacon sandwiches went down so well that all local supermarkets had run out of rolls by the end of the tournament!

Many thanks must be made to all team managers who ensured that their teams were at the right pitch at the right time and the referees who ensured that all games were played fairly.

We are seeking to appoint Leaders and Assistant Leaders to be in charge of the Hertfordshire Units to the 22nd World Scout Jamboree in Sweden during the summer of 2011. The Jamboree will be held on the fields of Rinkaby, not far from the town of Kristianstad, in the province of Skåne, southern Sweden.

The Jamboree Theme is Simply Scouting.

The World Scout Jamboree is a place for Scouting in all its variety, from all across the world and presents an exceptional programme, with a wide range of activities and opportunities for all.

The World Scout Jamboree focuses on implementing the Scout method. The values and processes that make Scouting what it is can be experienced and considered together.

If you talk to any of the 12 leaders who led our three units to the 2007 Jamboree in Essex, they will tell you that the job was challenging but extremely rewarding – a never to be forgotten experience!

The Jamboree Unit Leader role involves managing the training of a group of 36 young people which may include 12 year old Scouts at the time of the selection process, and 17 year old Explorer Scouts when the Jamboree takes place. In the past, successful Leaders have been those capable of responding to the changing needs of such a wide age range and in particular capable of an increasingly consultative style of leadership. Units have benefited from managing their own affairs as much as possible.
