#### **District Minibus**

The District is pleased to announce that we have purchased a new Mini Bus, not brand new, that's a bit too much money for the District, but one that is 5 years newer than our existing minibus. Currently our new bus is with Graham Hilton's garage undergoing a full service before having the Scout Logos and our District identity applied. The details:- it is a 2004, long wheel base, Ford Transit, white, has 17 seats, a tow bar and a half length roof rack. It's present mileage is showing 21,000, so it should be good for us for a number of years.



At present we intend to keep the Hire rates the same as at present the only likely change to the current hiring procedure is that we will re-introduce the requirement for a £50.00 deposit cheque to be left on collection, this will be returned to the hirer once the bus has been checked and found to be in as good a condition as it was on collection.

We hope to take ownership of the new bus on 1 June at which time our existing one will be smartened up by Graham Hilton and placed in the auctions for disposal. All monies from the proceeds of the sale will be returned to the District funds.

Scouting and encouraging more adults to volunteer their time.



The famous adventurer takes over when current Chief Scout, former Blue Peter presenter Peter Duncan, completes his five year tenure in July.

#### Letchworth and Baldock District Scouts Air Rifle Competition 2009

On Saturday 9 May 2009 Scout teams from across the District gathered for the annual air rifle competition. The venue was Deb and Mick Dilley's

big barn at Wrayfield farm, Stotfold. The weather was perfect. The only possible fly in the ointment was the road closures caused by the Stotfold Mill Fair just down the road. But I had issued a map with the diversion on so that was taken care of.

Mick and 2<sup>nd</sup> Baldock Scouts had set the range out on Friday night so all that was left to do was hang the targets up.

This year I changed the format a little. Each team was allocated a 30 minute slot during the day. On arrival they had a chance to warm up on a 'plinking range' where the targets were a shiny red fire bell and a set of spinners. If they made the fire bell ring they won a bar of chocolate. They then moved onto the competition range to shoot their individual targets to decide the individual best shot. They then shot as a team at a team target consisting of 20 small targets to decide the best team.

I was ably assisted by a team of air rifle instructors comprising Leslie Gwilt, Geoff Smith and Chris Lewis

This year we had fourteen teams totalling fifty seven Scouts from across the District.

At 9:30 sharp 4<sup>th</sup> Letchworth arrived. After a read of the range rules Geoff Smith took them onto the plinking range. Very quickly the fire bell started to ring and didn't stop all day. In fact we had to give out so much chocolate we had only three bars left at the end of the day.

The day then passed in a blur. Some Scouts shot really well and got high scores, some got lower scores. Regardless there was a real buzz of enthusiasm. I was particularly impressed with how well behaved the Scouts were and how sensible they were once they took hold of the air rifles.

During the day Deb Dilley kept the teas and coffees coming out to sustain the instructors. Parents and Leaders who were supporting the teams also had the chance to shoot. We even had a few Explorer Scouts turn up.

The only real panic was when a member of one of the  $8^{th}$  Letchworth teams Karelle Romans, didn't arrive. Thanks to the wonders of mobile phones she was quickly tracked down. And where was she – stuck behind a traction engine on its way to the Mill Fair. I thought I had covered that one – obviously not well enough.

The final three teams were from 7<sup>th</sup> Letchworth who had hiked all the way from Wymondley Wood after sleeping there on Friday night, well done to them.

As quickly as it started it was all over with time for the instructors to sit down for a final cup of tea. Not only had fifty seven Scouts shot we also had seventeen adults and Explorer Scouts shoot totalling eighty one entrants. Between them they used one thousand five hundred pellets.

Everyone wanted to know where they had come but had to go away on tender hooks to await for the scores to be added up overnight.

Congratulations to all winners particularly  $8^{th}$  for retaining the team title. Congratulations also to all competitors and Leaders who organised teams.

It is with huge sadness we announce the passing (or in Scouting terms "going home") of Sue Lovelock on Sunday  $24^{th}$  May 2009 at home with her family.

Sue started her Scouting life with Letchworth and Baldock like many of us by becoming a member of a Group Executive Committee. This was at 5<sup>th</sup> Letchworth in 1984, a Group to which Sue remained loyal for all of her Scouting years. In 1992 she progressed from the committee to become a much loved and very respected Cub Scout Leader who saw 5<sup>th</sup>'s Pack grow in size and strength. For 10 years Sue remained the life and soul of the Pack and an essential part of the 5<sup>th</sup> Letchworth Scout Group. In 2002 she decided it was time for a break and to let the younger ones have a go at Leading and so reluctantly she stepped down from her active role and joined the District Scout Fellowship.

Whilst carrying out these roles, Sue was also a dedicated member of the District Executive, rarely missing a meeting and always sure to get her point of view across. She was totally committed to Scouting and everything it gave to the young people.

More recently Sue has been the driving force behind the District Fellowship activity programme and just like her days as a Cub Leader she increased the numbers, funds and reputation of our Fellowship with her infectious enthusiasm.

Sue's skills on the catering organisation over the years have been an absolute boon to the

Sue was an example to us all in Scouting, always there no matter what the occasion or the weather, always keen to help anyone who needed it and more importantly always quick to congratulate the young people in whatever tasks they were doing.

Sue will be sadly missed by all who knew her both within and outside Scouting. Our deepest sympathies go the Fred, Wayne, Dean and the rest of her family.


