Beaver Scout Residential Experiences and Visits Abroad Residential Experiences

From now on, all Beaver Scouts nights away events will be known as Residential Experiences. The rules on the time have been slightly relaxed and now Beaver Scouts Residential Experiences have a limit of one night

away, rather than the more restrictive 24 hours away.

The other major change is to be the type of Residential Experience. As well as indoor events Beaver Scouts will now be permitted to camp on their night away. This means that Beaver Scouts can join Group and District camps overnight without having to worry about finding indoor accommodation.

Also added to the POR rules is the minimum standard that each Beaver Scout should be offered the opportunity to attend a Nights Away experience every year.

Beaver Scouts Visits Abroad

Up until now Beaver Scouts haven't been included in the rules which has caused some problems. The changes to the rules will allow Beaver Scouts to go overseas only in the care of nominated adults. It has been made clear in the guidelines that this is to remain an option.


