Mix all the ingredients together in a Scout HQ. Stir in plenty of enthusiasm and teamwork.


Allow to simmer for 2 hours.

When all had been cooked, judged, eaten and everything washed it was time for the usual tense moments whilst the scores were read out. With very close scores this




