Highlights of the year included three large events organised by the Guide Districts of Letchworth Garden City, Hitchin and Stevenage to celebrate the Centenary of Girlguiding. We were also pleased to add cadets from the Hertfordshire and Metropolitan police forces to our list of visitors.

We have completed the internal and external decoration of all the buildings at the Centre as part of an on-going maintenance programme.

Unfortunately we are once again having problems with the pumps in the sewage system. We have been recommended an alternative system which we will install next time there is a problem with the pumps.

I would like to thank all the volunteers who give up so much of their time to make the Centre such a success. My thanks go to the management committee including our new member Jeff Robson and to all the wardens who are managing an ever increasing load especially during the summer months. The Centre has gained a high reputation in Scouting and Guiding and is one of the most popular in the region.
