We met with representatives from The Royal British Legion and Lee Boswell, the town centre manager, and have made the following arrangements.



Please get the shorter ones in the front etc. The reserved area is shown on the attached drawing and is basically the road lane nearest to the Nat West Bank leaving the pavement area for the public.
