The annual St George's Day parade was held in Letchworth and was organised by the local Cub team and centred around St George and the 100th anniversary of Cub Scouts, which is being celebrated this year.



The 500 strong parade started at Howard Gardens in the town and worked its way up Station Road and via the Broadway to Broadway Gardens. It was Led by the Assistant District Commissioners for Beavers, Cubs and Scouts and closely followed by Hartley, the District Commissioner and local councillors. Each group paraded, led by colour parties bearing the relevant unit and group flags. An impressive sight.
