The food at the station is terrific - breakfasts include porridge, eggs, beans,

sausages and bacon. After the refreshing food, we split up into our groups and headed off for the hills. Unlike other camps I had been on, when we were all hoping we would get the nice leaders, all the leaders at Lochearnhead were really friendly and supportive.

Walking through ice fields to mountain ridges and dense forests, we drank from fresh streams and camped at the foot of great towering mountains.

We returned tired but triumphant from the high camp, and were greeted back with a feast! A five course meal with traditional meals like haggis. After we had eaten until we couldn't move, we had a talent show. Each group had to come up with a sketch song or game to amuse the others.

The Leaders were mostly ex-scouts who like us, had come to Lochearnhead on previous times and had fallen in love with the rough charm of the Scottish hills, and had come to walk in them



again. The days were so packed that it felt like I was away for a month rather than a week. I learnt a lot, made new friends and am definitely coming back next year.


