Second Baldock had no Leaders for some time, but continued successfully with the help of Jeffrey Robson and other Letchworth District Rover Scouts and in October 1959 saw the foundation of the Mallory patrol with the first two Senior Scouts in the Catholic group, Michael Dilley and Clive Knights.

1961 was a historic year in other ways. The District gained no fewer than five new Queen's Scouts – Michael Dilley, who almost at once became Scoutmaster of Second Baldock troop;

Princess of Wales Carol Concert




